

## Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Talking about the country that we live in, making comparisons with an African country - animals and fruits, ways of life
- Showing empathy towards others
- Sharing with others
- Giving and receiving gifts
- Learning about different cultures and customs

## Communication & Language

- Sing known songs and rhymes with confidence
- Circle time and class discussions
- Sharing our weekend news

## Physical Development

- Getting dressed independently
- Handling tools safely and with increasing control
- Managing our own personal hygiene
- Using a pencil and holding it effectively to form recognisable letters and numbers, most of which are correctly formed
- Shows some understanding that good practices with regards to exercise, eating, sleeping and hygiene can contribute to good health
- Practices some appropriate safety measures without direct supervision

## English

- Reading books about Africa, maps and healthy living
- Independent writing, tricky word recognition & spelling
- Handwriting practise, letter sizing and formation
- Consolidating capital letter & full stops
- Introducing question marks
- Fruit salad recipes
- Story retelling and sequencing
- Handa's surprise story map

## Mathematics

- Making sets of given numbers and accurate counting to 100
- Counting on and back from a given number within 20
- Finding different ways to make a total within 10
- Addition and subtraction calculations using counting on and back
- Number bonds to 5 & 10 (mental recall and practically)
- Place value, tens and ones
- Measuring weights, heights and lengths using non-standard units.
- Tally charts/bar charts – our favourite fruits/African animals

## Expressive Art & Design

- Making African flags
- Fruit painting
- Still life pictures/paintings
- Making African beaded collars and necklaces
- African safari animals
- Animal print and patterns
- Sunset collage pictures
- Listening to African music and creating a dance

## How parents can support learning at home:

- Enjoy helping your daughter to recognise key words
- Supervise learning at home activities
- Practise flashcards frequently
- Support your daughter to become independent - getting dressed, packing bags, fastening coats etc.
- Support practising letter and number formation
- Support the practice of writing short sentences independently
