Thought of the Week. Leave a Little Kindness Wherever You Go Kindness at the Heart of Bowdon Prep

As I reflected on our thought for the week—"Leave a little kindness wherever you go"— I was reminded of one of Bowdon Prep's core values: Care for all. It's a value that isn't simply displayed on posters or spoken of in assemblies—it is lived every day in every corner of our school.

Since joining Bowdon Prep three years ago, I've become increasingly aware of just how deeply embedded kindness is in our culture. Walking through school, I see it everywhere: a girl helping a friend tie her laces; an encouraging word during a tricky maths challenge; a comforting arm placed gently around a shoulder; doors held open; smiles exchanged; heartfelt "thank yous" at the end of every lesson. These small moments may seem simple, but they speak volumes.

What makes this kindness so powerful is that it isn't sporadic or performative—it's consistent, it's genuine, and it's woven into the fabric of daily life at BPS. Our big red door is more than just the entrance to a school—it's a gateway into an environment built on respect, empathy, and support. These gestures of kindness don't happen by accident; they occur because of the special atmosphere cultivated by staff, pupils, and parents alike.

Kindness begins at home, and we are so fortunate to partner with families who clearly nurture these values from the earliest years.

That foundation is strengthened every day at school, where the children see kindness modeled and are encouraged to share it themselves. We are truly lucky to work with such supportive, values-driven families.

Kindness also extends far beyond our school walls. Two weeks ago, I shared my involvement with Manchester Sands and the amazing work of the Little Cloud charity, run by BPS parents Chris and Jenny Walsh - both charities supporting bereaved parents. I was deeply moved by the messages of support from our school community in response. It was a reminder that kindness can be expressed in words, gestures, and quiet encouragement and sometimes in standing alongside one another in more difficult times.

This year, our incredible Charity Captains have been outstanding ambassadors of our school values. Through their leadership and creativity, they've helped raise over £3,000 for causes beyond our school gates showing that the compassion cultivated at Bowdon Prep reaches far beyond our own community.

Kindness has been especially evident in my own classroom in Year 5. Throughout the year, the girls have supported one another so many meaningful ways-whether in the challenges of 11+ navigating preparations, offering friendship during tougher moments, or conquering fears together on our residential trip. I find myself genuinely taken aback by the unwavering support the girls show for one backs, and that sense of solidarity is something truly special. What has also stood out is how they celebrate each other's successes-they are genuinely delighted when a friend does well, and that kind of wholehearted joy for one another is rare, and very special.



Kindness, at BPS, is not a coincidence—it's a choice we make together, every single day. And in doing so, we really do give each of our pupils the **B**est **P**ossible **S**tart in life.

Bowdon Prep is more than a school. Bowdon Prep truly is a special place. It is a place where kindness thrives, where children learn that caring for others is one of the greatest strengths they can carry into the world.


