As a proud Girls on Board school, we are committed to nurturing not only the academic growth of our pupils but also their emotional intelligence, empathy, and leadership.

This summer term has been a shining example of what it means to empower girls to support one another, step into leadership roles, and grow together. We encourage our girls to take off the blinkers and look around —to notice who might need a helping hand, a kind word, or simply someone to sit beside. In our community, we don't want anyone to feel adrift or overlooked.

Everyone deserves a place on the friendship raft, and it's up to the pupils to make sure no one is left behind. It's about collaboration, not isolation. It's about building bridges, not walls. This term has offered countless opportunities for our girls to lead and champion each other. Whether performing on stage. competing with grace and determination on Sports Day, or embracing the challenges of the Year 6 residential, our pupils have shown that leadership doesn't always mean being at the front.

Their message tied in perfectly with our theme of the week: Do what you love, love what you do. We hope everyone finds time this weekend to enjoy the outdoors and take a moment to do something meaningful.

REACH MORE PARENTS APP -COMING SOON





Throughout the tour, the girls became real-life animal detectives, answering questions like: What do mole-rats eat? Why does a vulture need a hooked beak? 
