

Supporting Phoebe's Challenge – A Local Family in Need

This week, we wanted to share the story of Phoebe, a brave young girl from Altrincham who is facing an incredibly difficult journey. In February, Phoebe was diagnosed with an extremely rare and aggressive liver cancer.

Despite undergoing major surgery to remove over 80% of her liver, the tumours sadly returned, and she is now enduring 18 weeks of intensive chemotherapy. Once her treatment finishes, Phoebe will need a living donor liver transplant - a procedure no child in the UK has ever had for this type of cancer.

Her family are doing everything they can to give her the chance she deserves — to grow up, laugh, and live the life she was meant to. They may soon need to seek private medical treatment, either in the UK or abroad, to make that possible.

We know the Bowdon Prep community is caring and compassionate, and we'd like to come together to support Phoebe and her family during this time.

Year Five Step Back in Time to the Victorian Workhouse

From Bonnet to Blackboard – A Journey into Victorian Britain!

On Wednesday, Year 5 travelled to the historic Workhouse in Northwich as part of their study of Street Child by Berlie Doherty. The experience was nothing short of extraordinary, transporting pupils back to the harsh realities of Victorian England and offering a powerful insight into the lives of the poor and destitute.

As the children approached the grand but imposing doors of the Workhouse, excitement quickly turned to nervous anticipation. Waiting to greet them was the formidable Master Grim, whose stern expression and booming voice made quite the impression! His "warm" Victorian welcome certainly set the tone for the day ahead—there was no mistaking who was in charge. The children quickly learned that there would be no laughter, no chatter, and absolutely no dawdling in the corridors!





Dressed in their wonderfully authentic costumes—thank you to our ever-supportive parents for your outstanding efforts—the pupils looked every inch the Victorian pauper children they were portraying. Bonnet strings were tied, caps straightened, and aprons firmly in place as they prepared to experience a day of strict discipline, hard work, and a taste of 19th-century schooling.

Inside the Workhouse, the children took part in a range of immersive activities designed to bring their learning to life. They attended lessons in the old-fashioned schoolroom, writing on slate boards under the watchful eye of a very serious schoolmistress. They learned about the harsh routines that governed workhouse life—early mornings, gruelling chores, and meagre meals that left little room for comfort. Through hands-on tasks and roleplay, they gained a true sense of the hardship faced by Victorian children,




and understanding of Street Child, the powerful novel they are studying in class.

There were moments of laughter too, as the children threw themselves wholeheartedly into their roles. The staff at the Workhouse commented on how polite, enthusiastic, and impeccably behaved the group were throughout the day.

Mrs. Delf remarked, "It was wonderful to see the children so immersed in their learning. From the moment Master Grim greeted them, they were completely transported back in time. Their curiosity, respect, and sense of wonder made it a truly special experience."

A particular highlight came from Vivien, who joined BPS this term from the USA and has settled into Year 5 so beautifully. Reflecting on the trip, she said, "It was amazing to experience what life might have been like for children back then—it really made me appreciate school today! I loved dressing up and learning in such a different way." Her enthusiasm and positivity captured the spirit of the entire day.





The trip was a perfect blend of education and imagination—a day where history leapt from the pages of a book into the hearts and minds of every pupil. The children left the Workhouse tired but inspired, grateful for their modern comforts and eager to continue exploring the world of Victorian Britain back in the classroom.

A huge well done to all of Year 5 for their enthusiasm, exemplary behaviour, and willingness to embrace every moment—and an enormous thank you to parents for the effort and creativity that went into the children's costumes. It was a truly unforgettable day of learning, laughter, and living history!






