Winter Safety Matters at BPS


A Seasonal Reminder for Our School Community

As we move into the winter months and the darker evenings are upon us, we are reminded that the time of year brings unique challenges: reduced daylight, wet and icy conditions, and increased traffic during peak school hours. As a community, we will continue to do our utmost to ensure the safety of every child.

- Visibility is Key: Encourage your child to wear bright or reflective clothing and consider adding reflective strips to bags or coats.
- Safe Crossing Habits: Remind and support children to use designated crossings and wait until vehicles have fully stopped before stepping out.
- Stay Alert: Distractions like mobile phones and headphones can reduce awareness please remind children to keep their focus when out and about.
- Drivers: If you drive near school, please slow down, especially during drop-off and pick-up times. Be mindful where you park, children may be harder to see in poor light or bad weather.

Safety is intentional, not accidental—allowing children to thrive with confidence.

At Bowdon Prep, safety is never left to chance—it's the result of planning, vigilance, and teamwork between staff, parents, and pupils. Children are naturally curious and more vulnerable to accidents and we therefore prioritise a culture of care and safety at BPS.



From playground supervision to classroom design, every space and activity is risk-assessed. Staff receive regular training to handle emergencies and safeguarding concerns, and safety drills (fire, lockdown, and evacuation) are practised so everyone knows what to do calmly and confidently.

We continue to work hard to create an inclusive environment where every child feels seen, safe and protected and parents play a vital role. Open communication helps us understand and meet each child's needs and when home and school work together, we create the best outcomes for our pupils.







Enforcement of *School Keep Clear* markings in Trafford this half term.

Following last week's communication, we are sharing Trafford Council's important road safety message once again. The Council will soon increase enforcement of the 'School Keep Clear' markings outside our school, using a camera car to help keep these areas safe and unobstructed for pupils and families.

The Council explains that the yellow zig-zag zones ensure safe access for pedestrians and cyclists and reduce congestion during busy periods. Additional signage to indicate camera enforcement will be installed and camera car visits beginning this half term.

We kindly ask all parents and carers to take note of this reminder and support these measures to help keep our school community safe.

This practice not only reduces the demand for new clothing production but also helps to decrease pollution, water usage, and waste associated with the fashion industry

Time – Each class will visit the hall on a rota between 10.00 – 11.55am and will have 25 minutes to browse their allocated stall and swap their ticket for a fashion item.

Instructions

- Each pupil can bring in between 1-3 items that they would be proud to pass onto someone. The items need to be in very good condition with no stains/rips.
- Items included clothes (suitable sizing for their year group- including coats, trousers, shorts, dresses, jumpers etc – no crop tops please) scarves, hat, gloves and bags.

ISA STEM COMPETITION

YEAR 5 & 6

Your task: Design and build a self-sustaining terrarium

A terrarium is a sealed transparent container that contains plants (like a mini- garden) Self-sustaining means the garden can continue in a healthy state without outside assistance (including watering it) You will need to think about how the plant will 'water' itself and get nutrients from the material it is 'sown' in.

Which plants are fairly easy to look after. You will also need to include a PDF presentation to Introduce your design and explain how you created the terrarium. You will also need to identify what factors you needed to consider and include photographs of the terrarium at different stages of production, showing you involved in its production.

Finally, you will need to show photographs of the finished terrarium. Any video clips should be no longer than 2 minutes and should be embedded in the presentation.

Your task: Could you build and design a rollercoaster for a marble?

Put your creativity and engineering skills to the test! Use ramps, loops, and twists to construct an exciting track that safely carries a marble from start to finish. Experiment, problem-solve, and see how thrilling you can make the ride!

The closing date for entries is 12th December 2025. We will submit 4 entries online in January. The Final will be on 19th March 2026 and successful candidates will be asked to present their project to the judges. Good Luck!


