That's why pencils have rubbers, the lessons we learn from overcoming challenges are often the most lasting. By embracing challenges, our girls become confident, adaptable learners who understand that growth comes through effort, persistence, and belief in themselves.

Together, we can continue to support our girls in developing the resilience and determination they need to thrive - not just at school, but in every aspect of their future lives. As a result, they can truly Believe, Persevere and Succeed in Life.



Welcome to Bowdon's very first Eco fashion swap run by the School Council team. This is a brilliant opportunity to give a piece of clothing a new home. Allow someone else's pre-loved clothes to become your treasure!

Fashion swaps, also known as clothing sustainable practice that swaps. are a benefits environment, the promotes community, and supports local economies. involve two or more exchanging pre-loved, gently used clothing, giving each other a newhome and a second life. This practice not only reduces the demand for new clothing production but also helps to decrease pollution, water usage, and waste associated with the fashion industry

When – Friday 5th December 2025 **Where** – BPS Prep Gym

Time – Each class will visit the hall on a rota between 10.00 – 11.55am and will have 25 minutes to browse their allocated stall and swap their ticket for a fashion item.

Instructions

- Each pupil can bring in between 1-3 items that they would be proud to pass onto someone. The items need to be in very good condition with no stains/rips.
- Items included clothes (suitable sizing for their year group- including coats, trousers, shorts, dresses, jumpers etc – no crop tops please) scarves, hat, gloves and bags.

Each Form Teacher will be given a set of tokens, when a pupil brings in an item for the fashion swap; the girls will be presented with a token that will allow them to pick one different item from the stall. Any items left over will be donated to the BPS society or local charities.

When do I bring my items in?

Please bring in your item/items into school the week commencing Monday 1st December, where your Form Teacher will store them until Friday morning. They will then be sent to the Prep Gym at 9am on Friday (Kindergarten and Reception, the Year 6 school council team will collect yours).

Year 4 Scientists Shine at the Catalyst Museum an Inspiring Science Experience

A day of discovery, curiosity, and hands-on STEM learning in Widnes.

On Thursday, our Year 4 girls enjoyed an exciting and enriching trip to the Catalyst Museum in Widnes, where they developed their scientific understanding through hands-on exploration.


In the first workshop, the children donned coats and safety goggles before alkalis. investigating acids and Usina pipettes, spotting tiles, and indicator solutions, they worked like real scientists to test and identify a range of unknown liquids. Their confidence grew as they mastered new techniques and applied their developing knowledge of chemistry.

During the second session, pupils deepened their understanding of electricity by experimenting with different types of switches. They even designed and built their own, marvelling at how scientific concepts could be brought to life in such a practical and engaging way.

The Year 4 girls thoroughly enjoyed learning through play and experimentation with the museum's interactive exhibits. It was a wonderful day filled with discovery, excitement, and hands-on STEM learning — one they will remember for a long time!









ISA STEM COMPETITION

YEAR 5 & 6

Your task: Design and build a self-sustaining terrarium

A terrarium is a sealed transparent container that contains plants (like a mini- garden) Self-sustaining means the garden can continue in a healthy state without outside assistance (including watering it) You will need to think about how the plant will 'water' itself and get nutrients from the material it is 'sown' in.

Which plants are fairly easy to look after. You will also need to include a PDF presentation to Introduce your design and explain how you created the terrarium. You will also need to identify what factors you needed to consider and include photographs of the terrarium at different stages of production, showing you involved in its production.

Finally, you will need to show photographs of the finished terrarium. Any video clips should be no longer than 2 minutes and should be embedded in the presentation.

YEAR 3 & 4

Your task: Could you build and design a rollercoaster for a marble?

Put your creativity and engineering skills to the test! Use ramps, loops, and twists to construct an exciting track that safely carries a marble from start to finish. Experiment, problem-solve, and see how thrilling you can make the ride!

The closing date for entries is 12th December 2025. We will submit 4 entries online in January. The Final will be on 19th March 2026 and successful candidates will be asked to present their project to the judges. Good Luck!


